## *Emergency Equipment*

TAPRC will provide each coach with an equipment bag that includes first-aid supplies and extra cold packs. disinfectant spray. Each field shed will also include these items along hand sanitizer and cleaning supplies.

## *Injury Reporting*

If a player gets injured please respond and provide care first! After the situation is under control make sure to notify TAPRC director Emily Dock. She will walk the player's parent through the injury reporting process (which may include contact with TAPRC's insurance company).

## *Severe Weather Response*

When inclement weather occurs, coaches should consult Emily Dock, director, and decide on plans. Our goal is to notify families of decisions at least 30 minutes before an event. If the weather event happens during practice or a game the coaches and umpire will make the call. The following policies must be considered:

- When lightning is observed or thunder is heard, the contest or practice must be suspended. The occurrence of lightning or thunder is not subject to interpretation or discussion.
- Severe weather in the form of rain or snow may make the field unplayable.
